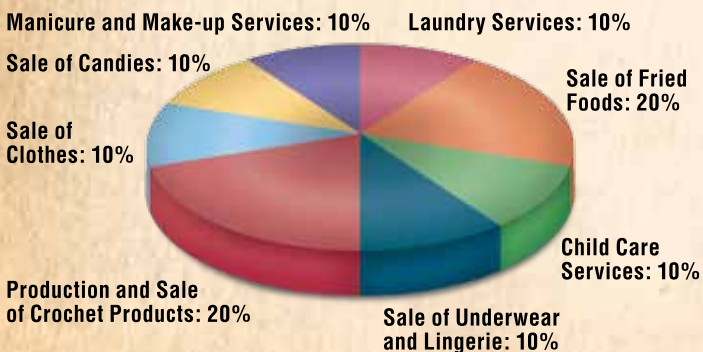
LOAN

Village bank members begin with an average loan of \$150 which is repaid over 5-8 months (called a “loan cycle”). Women also make deposits into personal savings accounts. At the successful conclusion of their loan cycle, a woman is eligible to receive another loan equal to the original loan plus the amount deposited into her savings account.

Each village bank member utilizes loan money and educational opportunities to create her business. The women of Divino Niño are currently developing these businesses:



LEARN

Women attend classes at Hope House, business sessions during village bank meetings, and receive personal consultations. There are also classes on family wellness and basic education. Women learn craft skills in the classroom to develop a secondary business (such as the sale of jewelry or crochet) which further stabilizes their income.
